Opinion Survey for Parents (OSP) Grades 6-12

Scoring Option 1

Disaggregrated Results. No disaggregrated results for this option

Survey Administration. There are two common ways to administer the OSP that are compatible with Scoring Option 1:

- (1) Distribute and collect one OSP survey form from each household with one or more children attending the school
- (2) Distribute and collect survey forms to "family" at a school event (i.e., parent-teacher conference, family math night, etc.)

Scoring Option 2

Disaggregrated Results. Results can be disaggregrated by students' gender (M/F), ethnic group (W/H/O) and grade level (1/2...7/8)

Survey Administration. It is necessary to have parents complete one OSP survey form for each of their children attending the school. Attention must be paid to:

- (1) <u>Coding the Questionnaire</u>. There is a code at the end of the parent questionnaire to indicate the student's gender (M/F), ethnic group (White, Hispanic, Other), and grade level (6-12). The teacher (or aide or administrator) who is conducting the survey should mark these student designations on the survey form **before** it is presented to the parents. Once the form is coded, attach the student's name to it using a temporary "post-it note."
- (2) <u>Distributing/Collecting the Surveys</u>. Come up with a sound distribution and collection procedure (with appropriate follow-up) to make sure that Jessica's parents get, fill out, and return the form coded for Jessica, i.e., complete the form that Jessica's teacher has coded as F/H/9. You should ask the parents to remove the "post-it note" with the student name before returning the questionnaire to the school.
